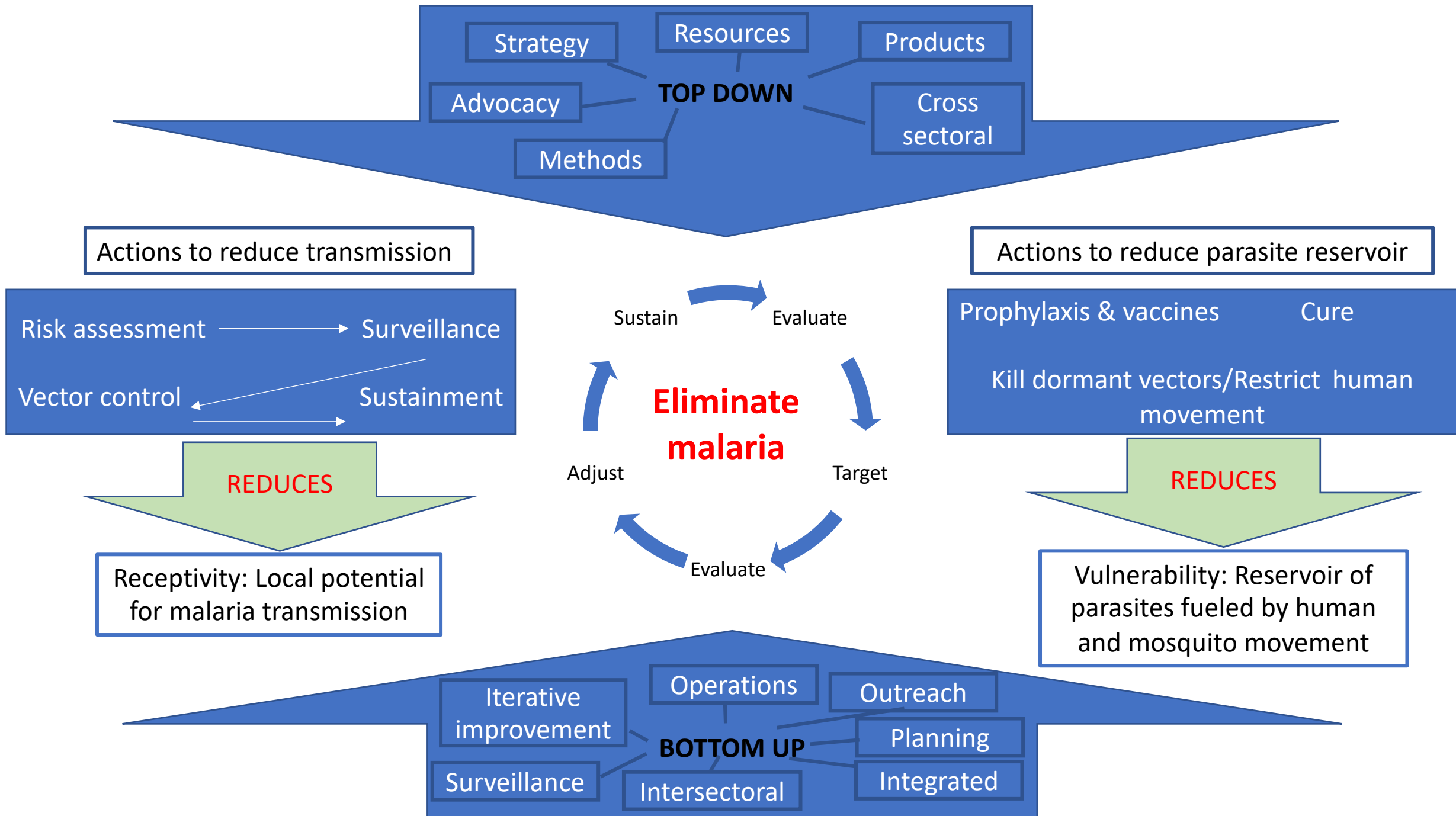


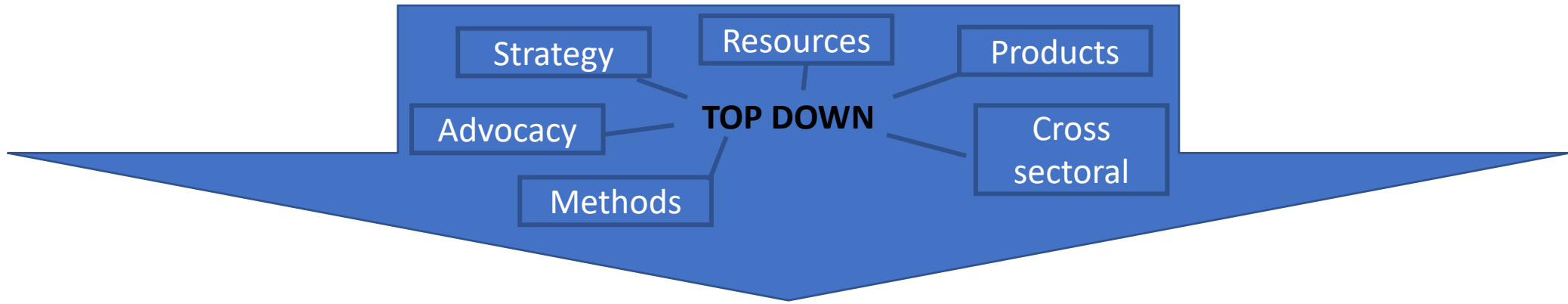

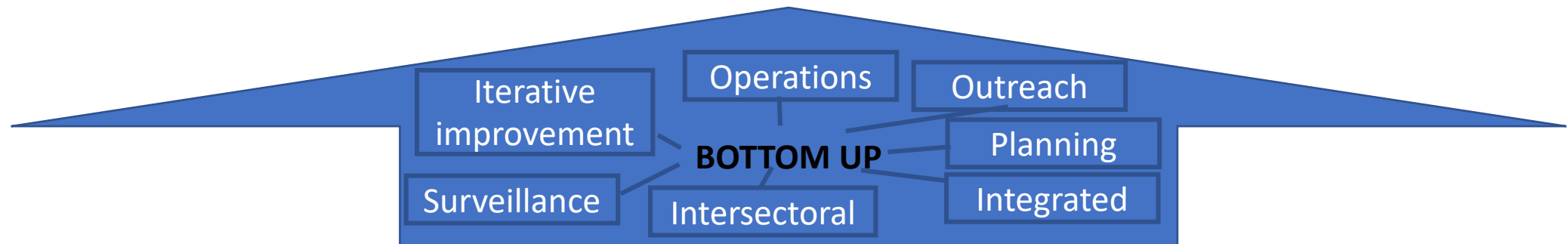


Going from global goals to local impact by contributing:
